Former Musqueam chief joins major financial firm as senior advisor

This past March, Wendy Grant-John joined Deloitte's National Aboriginal Client Services Practice as Senior Advisor.

Ms. Grant-John is an influential leader in the First Nations community and has been recognized for her significant work in advancing the cultural, political and economic base of the Musqueam community.

Ms. Grant-John served three terms as Chief of the Musqueam First Nations. She was the first woman elected Regional Vice-Chief to the Assembly of First Nations, and was also the Co-Chair of the Renewal Commission for the Assembly of First Nations.

As Musqueam Chief, Wendy Grant-John launched the first Aboriginal commercial fishery in Canada, and was involved with her community in winning two landmark Supreme Court cases that solidified Aboriginal rights in the Constitution.

She previously worked at Indian and Northern Affairs Canada as Associate Regional Director-General of British Columbia, and served as a lay bencher of the Law Society of British Columbia. Ms. Grant-John also served as a board member with Canadian Lands Company Limited, as well as served as a Commissioner on the Pacific Salmon Commission. She was a founding member and board member

of the Aboriginal Healing Foundation and a founder of Musqueam Weavers.

Ms. Grant-John has an honorary doctorate of Law from Royal Roads University and has won many distinctions and awards, including the 2001 YWCA Woman of Distinction Award for Social Action. At the 2006 National Aboriginal Achievement Awards, she was recognized for her 30 year career in advancing Aboriginal cultural, social and political advancement in Canada and for diversifying the economic base of the Musqueam First Nation.
