The U of R, located in the heart of Wascana Centre – one of the largest urban parks in North America – is a welcoming, student-focused institution that combines deep-rooted values with innovative thinking, classroom theory with real-world practice, and global ideas with regional needs.

Building on its history as a mid-sized, comprehensive, liberal arts university, the U of R is poised to become an even more attractive choice for a quality educational experience by increasing student engagement, enhancing community connections and expanding research.

As the first university in western Canada to start a Co-operative Education program in 1969, the U of R continues to be a leader in this area. During 2008, U of R co-op students earned nearly \$7,000,000. The list of co-op choices is growing with more programs being introduced for Arts and Business Administration graduate students.

The U of R continues to adapt its academic offerings to meet the changing needs of students and expanding career options. The newest courses include a Master's Certificate in Organizational Leadership; a Master's of Administration with a major in Leadership; and a graduate program in Software Systems Engineering.

The U of R is well known for a variety of programs including actuarial science, education, petroleum engineering, police studies and social work. It's the only university on the prairies to offer journalism and film and video undergraduate degree programs.

Three federated colleges are partnered with the U of R – Champion College, the First Nations University of Canada and Luther College. Champion and Luther are liberal arts colleges which also emphasize a strong sense of community. The First Nations University of Canada offers post-secondary education in a culturally-supportive First Nations environment.

The U of R features world-class research in educational psychology, energy and the environment, food safety, interactive media and physics. It is best known for research into carbon capture and storage (CCS) technologies. Researchers at the U of R, along with government and industry partners, have developed a wide range of technologies for reducing carbon dioxide emissions. The University has one of the most sophisticated labs in North America devoted to developing and demonstrating carbon capture technologies – research that is now ready for commercial testing.

Situated in a unique natural setting, the campus is also home to the Canadian Plains Research Center, the Centre on Aging and Health, and the Institut français, which provides French-language academic programming, cultural events and social activities.

Through increased student engagement, enhanced community connections and growing world-class research, the U of R is responding to the needs and aspirations of students, citizens and communities – and reaching out to the world around us. ♦

Northlands College, Saskatchewan

Northlands College is a public post-secondary institution serving the northern half of the province of Saskatchewan, a region that holds less than 4% of the province's population. Of the almost 36,000 residents, approximately 84% are of Aboriginal ancestry (Cree, Dene and Metis). With its Administration centre in Air Ronge, Northlands College operates program centres in Buffalo Narrows, La Ronge and Creighton; and classes in most of the north's 40 communities.

The College's primary mandate is to provide training linked to employment. Programs and services include:

- **Trades and Related Training:** Based on labour market demand, Northlands College in partnership with SIAST and the Apprenticeship Commission, offer apprenticeship level training in a number of trade areas as well as trades related training.
- **University:** Northlands College is an official off-campus Arts and Science site, offering courses from both the University of Saskatchewan and the University of Regina. As well, Northlands College and University of the Arctic offer online courses from the Bachelor of Circumpolar Studies Advanced Emphasis Program. Students in northern Saskatchewan are finding these programs of particular relevance.
- **Mine & Oil Sands Training:** A variety of training to employment programs related to the mining and oil sands industry in Northern Saskatchewan are offered in order to prepare northerners for occupations in all phases of the mining and oil sands sectors.
- **Business:** Business courses range from fully accredited SIAST certificate programs to non-credit training. Some of the accredited short courses may be applied towards full certificate training programs. Many of the business programs include a work placement component which ensures the student the opportunity to gain practical on-the-job experience.
- **Forestry:** Program delivery is dependant on joint venture funding arrangements with industry and other agencies who are committed to on-going employment for trainees after the training is complete.
- **Health & Community Services:** Courses in this sector are offered in response to labour market trends and community needs.
- **Adult Upgrading:** Northlands College offers a variety of upgrading programs for people who are interested in improving their employment opportunities, meeting entrance requirements to post-secondary institutions and personal development. Programs range from Adult 12 to literacy.
- **Career and Academic Counseling Services:** Northlands College Counselors can assist you in planning a career that suits your interests and aspirations. If this involves post-secondary education, we can help you through the maze of regulations and requirements of various institutions and assist you with student loan applications or other forms of student financial assistance.
