JUST A 15-MINUTE DRIVE from Phoenix, AZ, Midwestern University (MWU) offers upper-level undergraduate and graduate healthcare education programs in a friendly southwest setting.

Our 135-acre campus is home to 1060 students and offers beautiful new state-of-the-art facilities, individualized attention, and hands-on learning. Students from all three colleges—the Arizona College of Osteopathic Medicine (AZCOM), the College of Health Sciences, and the College of Pharmacy—Glendale—work together as a team, taking interdisciplinary courses and collaborating with faculty and professional colleagues to learn how to create a truly patient-centered practice.

For undergraduate students with a serious interest in the health sciences, MWU offers a Bachelor of Biomedical Sciences degree.

Qualified students spend their first two undergraduate years at another accredited institution to obtain prerequisite courses, then complete the degree during two final years at MWU. The curriculum is designed to prepare students to obtain positions as laboratory technicians or supervisors in

biotechnology or pharmaceutical industries, or to become highly competitive candidates for admission to professional schools of medicine, pharmacy, dentistry, and other allied health sciences.

At MWU, learning through community service and clinical experience is specially emphasized.

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AZCOM is one of only a few schools in the nation to offer clinical exposure in the first year, with expanded rotation opportunities for Native American students throughout all four years at the Phoenix Indian Medical Center and other IHS hospitals and clinics around the state. Students from all programs have the opportunity to volunteer for local health fairs, school education programs, sports physicals, community diabetes screenings, and

medical missions.

Student clubs are an active and vibrant part of campus life, from the Integrative Medicine Club to the Student National Medical Association, whose mission is to promote diversity in the field of medicine. Students have even created an ongoing program providing weekly medical care for the homeless in downtown Phoenix.

There is no shortage of opportunities for putting your healthcare education into practice and helping others while you learn.

The University's natural Arizona setting offers recreational activities year-round in the nearby Matatzal and Maricopa mountains, and Phoenix boasts first-class cultural events, pro sports, and other entertainment.

On-campus housing offers studio and one- and two-bedroom apartments with cable TV and Internet access, a swimming pool, recreational center, and 24-hour security.

The Student Services Staff works year-round to create exciting on-campus activities for students, including intramural sports, yoga classes, coffeehouses, cultural festivals, hoop dancing, hiking and rafting trips, and more.
